AVERA HOME HOSPICE PROGRAM is in need of volunteers. This need can only be filled by someone willing to give of their time when patients and their families need it most. Volunteers are such an important part of the team that the government requires that the number of hours that hospice volunteers contribute must equal at least 5% of the total number of patient care hours provided by paid staff. With the Hospice House now located on the Majestic Bluffs campus, the increased admissions of residents in long-term care, and the growing area of coverage, we need volunteers more than we ever have before. A hospice volunteer is most effective if they are a good listener, can be comfortable in silence, are respectful of all ways of life, are willing to help with light tasks as needed, and have a spirit of compassion and understanding towards those who are on the end-of-life journey. There is an initial investment of time in paperwork and training but once approved it is more of a commitment to make an impact on the lives of the patients we care for and their families.
