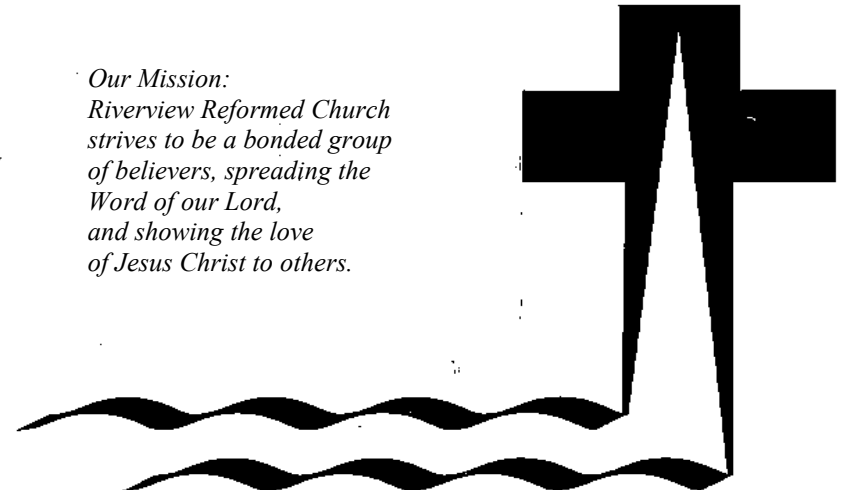

Also, general hygiene items are needed such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, bar soaps, shampoo, conditioner, toilet paper, laundry soap, dish soap, men & women's deodorants. Monetary donations are greatly appreciated as well, to buy fresh foods weekly, such as milk, eggs, cheese & meats.
