

COMMUNION NEXT SUNDAY For those who come to in-building service, it will be distributed as you leave the service, and an extra 1/2 hour allocated for those who view live-stream to come to the building....BUT WATCH FOR DETAILS THRU THE WEEK!

WORSHIP SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE VIA: ON-LINE STREAMING.

If you are unable to do on-line streaming, you can access the service on your Cable TV Public Access channel on Saturdays at 7:00 PM. For on-line streaming, please tune in starting at 9:15 AM, service to begin at 9:30 AM. This is available thru the Facebook page and thru email links. If you are unable to do any of the suggestions, please watch a service on TV of your choice.

If you cannot do the service on Sunday morning on-line or are not comfortable to come into the building yet, another option is to come to the NORTH parking lot (by the kitchen) and remain in your vehicle and tune your radio to 89.1 FM and you should be able to hear the service

Please Remember although we aren't passing the offering plates, you can still send your offerings to the church thru the mail, bring them at any time and slip them in the mail slot of the door on the south west corner of the sanctuary (behind the piano area), or you can ask one of the deacons about the new on-line giving site <https://tithe.ly/widget/v3/give.js?3> which is also available on the church website.

CONSISTORY REPORT TO CONGREGATION:

Meeting held May 11. The Elders addressed the constitutional question. They discussed the calling report and prayer requests. Pastor Jake will email a prayer list to each elder. June communion procedures were discussed. The Deacons reported that the Boy Scout project has been put on hold. Bathrooms have been repaired. The church received monies from the CARES Act (from the stimulus package). These monies will not need to be repaid if they are used for salaries. If not, interest rate on loan is 1%. Some trees need to be removed this spring. A lawn mowing plan has been made. Air Conditioning units have been checked. The deacons will decide if they need to replace Lisa Kuipers, who is moving in July, or if they will wait until the election in November. Ministry Team meetings will remain on hold throughout the summer and plan to meet again in the fall. Feeding Yankton was discussed. They will be asked to be in a new location by June 1. Youth Group is meeting weekly via: Zoom. A motion was made/seconded to reopen the church to in-person services starting May 17, with measures in place to keep members separated safely. There will be no fellowship time. Decision to continue in-person services will be fluid as it may be necessary to consider an alternate plan at a later date.

We are always looking for new and additional volunteers to help as Praise song leaders, opening/closing the church on Sunday mornings, selling HyVee cards, running the video camera, sound system and power point, Lay Leaders, greeters, organists, pianists, etc. If this is something you would consider doing, please let the church office know. The more people on the scheduled rotations, the fewer times for everyone involved. The Worship Ministry Team is in the process of creating info sheets for new people, that will include contact people for each area and guidelines to follow

Guide for In-Person Sunday Services

As a Consistory we have set these guidelines as we open church up to in-person services. Please be aware that these guidelines, along with our plans, are tentative and will be based on information as we receive it on a day-to-day basis. Please stay up to date via the bulletins and email announcements we will send out about what things will look like from week to week.

Entry into Church:

Doors will open at 9:10 am, Ushers (Elders for this week) will arrive at 9 am

Main doors for entry will be the front door and the north kitchen door.

If you have any symptoms please don't enter. For example having a fever.

Hand sanitizer stations will be by the fellowship hall sanctuary doors.

The fellowship hall sanctuary doors will have stations to deposit offerings.

There is blue tape on carpet as you enter the church marking 6 feet distance

Regarding Seating:

We will be having elders ushering people to their seats.

We will be seating people every two pews starting from the front and work back.

We will be seating people from the center aisle.

Overflow will go into the fellowship hall.

Back pews will be reserved for handicap and other individuals.

Balcony will be reserved for families with kids.

Regarding the Service:

There will be no passing of plates. There will be no greeting time.

When the service is over, please wait for Ushers to come dismiss you.

For those who choose not to attend, we will still be live streaming the service on YouTube, Facebook and on the Radio on FM 89.1

Regarding Time at Church:

No fellowship time; coffee and juice will not be served. No bulletins for this Sunday

Areas are roped off to limit the space available to access.

Be Respectful, Keep Distance, Practice Good Hygiene, Please Don't Judge.

Masks are optional, but encouraged for those with health concerns, Usher will have masks available.

Sanctuary will be deep cleaned once a week.

Hy-Vee cards will not be sold on Sunday, however you can continue to get them during the week by contacting Pastor Jake or Teresa.

An Usher will take a picture to record where everyone sits. This is in case someone from church gets Covid-19 we can track who was next to that person.
