

You can put it in the little chest freezer.

Help with live-stream/power point Things are finally finding new routines with church after covid brought changes. One of those changes was streaming our Sunday services. Now that the changes made for streaming are stable for the long term, we are asking for volunteers to help with Streaming/Sound board and Powerpoint. If you are interested in helping or have questions with streaming and sound board, we ask you to please contact Pastor Jake, Dan Sanow, or Todd Carr. Membership Class The Elders have decided to offer a membership class due to requests for membership and baptisms. UPCOMING COMMUNION The Easter season is upon us. Normally we have communion the first Sunday of each even month, but the Elders have decided to have communion Maundy Thursday, April 1, and not Easter Sunday, April 4. The Elders have also decided to make changes in how we do Communion during Covid. It has been decided to go back to distributing the elements in the front of the church. The Elders will wear gloves and masks while distributing the bread and juice. Another Elder will usher people from the pews to maintain social distancing while going to the front of the sanctuary. For those still not comfortable with this can partake of communion in the entryway to church on the southside after the service or via the drive thru option..

Consistory Meeting Update: Consistory was held on Monday, March . The Elders discussed changes to how we do communion during covid, and offering a membership class. The deacons reported on our current financial situation with current checking being \$43,000 and mortgage at \$48,484.60. The Soupless Soup Kitchen got within a couple hundred of its \$5,000 matching number (\$4,634.00 to date), which will go to the next mortgage payment. Consistory has made changes to the guidelines for inperson services that will provide more seating in the sanctuary as more people come to in-person services.

Opening/Closing Church building We have gotten a couple more volunteers to help with opening/locking the building on Sunday mornings, but can always use a few more.
