APRIL 12, CONSISTORY MEETING UPDATE: The elders approved the transfer of a member and are considering a letter to be sent as part of the yearly membership review. The Deacons reported on a variety of projects and activities happening or planned for RRC. In checking, we have about \$60,000, an increase from last month due to anonymous donations. The Banquet was able to use our donations of food to serve 263 individuals. Plans have been furthered on having a Boy Scout paint lines and put up signs in the parking lot, along with doing landscaping around the church. There was discussion to put handrails up in the front of the sanctuary. As a consistory, we talked about the Great Commandments (Matthew 22:34-40) and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20). The consistory plans on restarting ministry teams on May 18 at 7 PM. In May, Dakota Classis representatives plan to meet with the consistory, and our congregation in August, about our petition to leave the RCA. Consistory has decided to allow for coffee, juice and snacks to be brought back to the fellowship hour after church. There is a sign up sheet for those willing to make/serve coffee, juice and snacks on Sundays. Servers are asked to wear a mask and gloves while serving.
