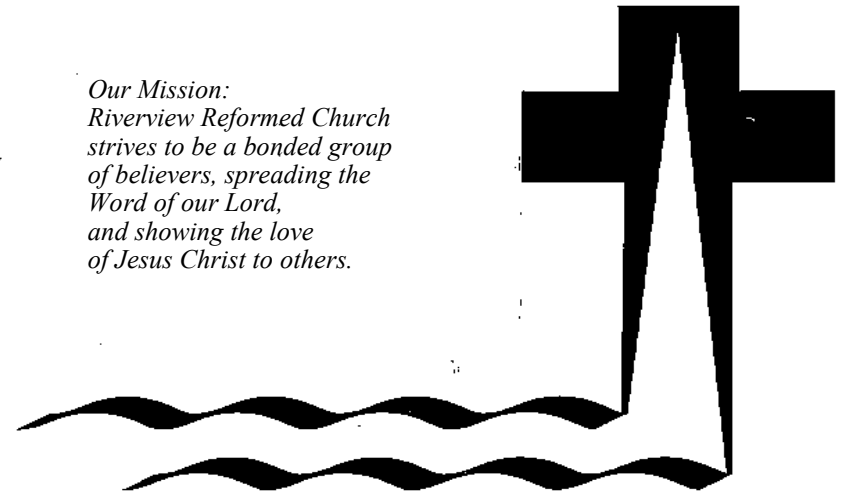

February 17 Consistory Update:

Our devotion at Consistory came from Acts 2:36-47 where we considered the growth of the early church, the message of the gospel and calling to hear and practice the way of Jesus. Elders discussed having communion in April only on Maundy Thursday and had a discussion around the future of RRC and what are the priorities we need going forward. Deacons shared how this is the first month in awhile where the checking balance had an increase which now is at \$21,505.80. They gave an update on the progress of the loan balance which is at \$14,296 and on the generosity already shown with the soupless soup kitchen. The deacons discussed more mission opportunities like helping pay for toilet seats for Pathways, in April we will be serving at the banquet and hope to collect socks and underwear to distribute and how they sent a thank you to those in the boy scouts who painted our parking lot. The rest of the Consistory meeting we discussed doing something different for Ministry Teams in April/May, possible changes in RRC by-laws, Articles of Incorporation, Separation Agreement and website, Pastor Jake's responsibilities with Cluster, the Living Last Supper that will be at church April 11 at 7 pm and a meeting with the Classis/Network Pastor Seth that will be June 8. Please pray with the Consistory as we consider what is the future of RRC.

Mission possibility For anyone looking for an extra mission to help support, on the bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall is information on "Hope for the Hopeless H20". This organization was founded by people, including Doyle Becker (Virginia Ballard's brother) who lives in Sioux Falls. They are helping people in Liberia, particularly orphans. They found a need in which these orphans were being housed in a 3 bedroom location (many children sleeping on the floors), so they are helping to build a proper orphanage, school, etc. Doyle Becker is the financial officer, so you can be assured that all money goes directly to "Hope for the Hopeless" and is not lining the pockets of a rich CEO in an office.

Come participate in the 2:00 PM service and stay for coffee afterward.
