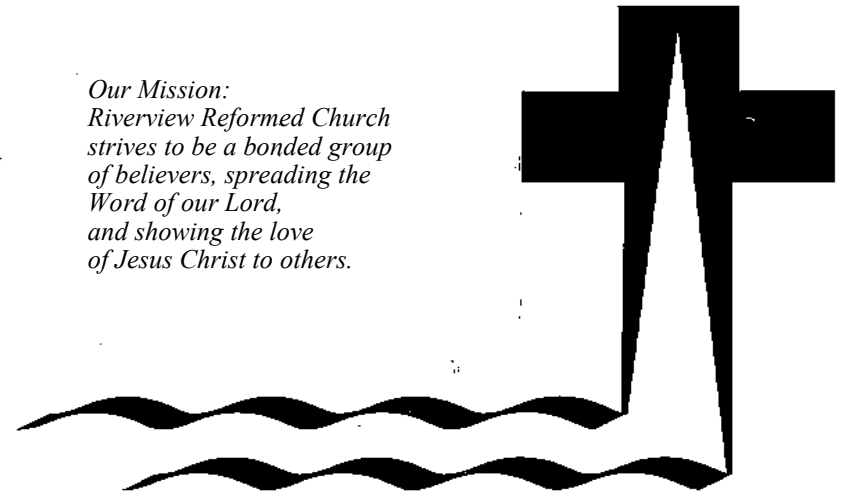

KEEP YANKTON BEAUTIFUL SETS DATE FOR GREAT AMERICAN

CLEANUP (Yankton, SD | April 4, 2022) Keep Yankton Beautiful Sets Date for Great American Cleanup Keep Yankton Beautiful is excited to announce the date for the 2022 Great American Cleanup. This event will take place from 9-11 a.m. on Saturday, April 30, 2022. Individuals, businesses, civic organizations, church groups, families, and any other group interested in participating are invited to join us starting at 9 a.m. at the Fantle Memorial south picnic shelter. The event will begin with a safety briefing, bag and glove distribution, and route assignments. Volunteers will then walk or drive to their chosen/designated routes to pick up litter. Routes typically take no more than an hour to clean, and volunteers may leave their collected garbage on the side of the route for Keep Yankton Beautiful board members to collect. Groups who wish to clean their route on a weekday while still having their collected litter count towards the Great American Cleanup totals may do so between Saturday, April 30, and Saturday, May 7. Bags, gloves, and routes will be provided to these groups and may be picked up at the park during the event on Saturday, April 30, from 9-10 a.m. The Great American Cleanup (GAC) is the nation's largest community improvement program, taking place annually with over a half-million volunteers participating within the hundreds of Keep America Beautiful affiliates nationwide. On average, Keep Yankton Beautiful's Great American Cleanup includes over 300 participants and over 3,000 pounds of trash collected annually. We look forward to another successful cleanup event on Saturday, April 30, 2022. Together, we Keep Yankton Beautiful!

MARCH 14 Consistory Update:

Our devotion at Consistory was from Acts 2:36-47. The passage helped us dig deeply in the question "what is church?" We had a very powerful discussion around the church in Acts and the church at RRC. Two of the biggest take-aways were around having testimonies be a part of the service and that only by having a deep desire to love and follow the resurrected Jesus can we be what a church is called to be. Seth, Class/Network Pastor, was able to join and explore with us Pastor Jake's responsibilities and what accountability can look like for members now that we have joined ARC. Discussion around the creation of a team of 6-8 member from church to be formed to discern with Seth the future of RRC. It was noted that in April we will only have communion once, on April 14 at the Maundy Thursday service, and NOT on the first Sunday of April. Deacons discussed current finances being: checking \$20,854.22, HyVee account balance \$12,503.01, Soupless Soup Kitchen \$2,566, Loan Balance \$12,608.06, and a donation of \$500 to be sent to help people in Ukraine.
