

APRIL 18 Consistory Update:

CONSISTORY DISCUSSED Acts 6:1-7 and how the early church leaders dealt with a struggle which led to fruitful discussion around the roles of leaders in the church, calling, using our spiritual gifts and faith in Jesus. The elders discussed how things are going with communion and what to do going forward. This led to a decision to begin doing a variety of different ways of doing communion and focus on Jesus who is at the center of this sacrament as a way to think more about our need to be devoted to Jesus. The Deacons discussed current finances—. Checking \$21,032.01, HyVee cards \$13,555, Soup Kitchen \$2,566, Loan balance \$10.920. The Deacons have a variety of projects going on, registering keys people have for the church, removing stumps, and plugging the bathroom toilet in the front of the sanctuary. As a consistory we discussed our next ministry team meeting and having ideas like head usher or host/hostesses being talked about at the next meeting, liability considerations for children programs, Pastor Jake looking into some volunteer opportunities in the community and most of the time was spent discussing what is the purpose of our church so as to better clarify what direction we want a committee considering the future of RRC to have.
