

CONSISTORY DISCUSSED Acts 6:1-7 and how the early church leaders dealt with a struggle which led to fruitful discussion around the roles of leaders in the church, calling, using our spiritual gifts and faith in Jesus. The elders discussed how things are going with communion and what to do going forward. This led to a decision to begin doing a variety of different ways of doing communion and focus on Jesus who is at the center of this sacrament as a way to think more about our need to be devoted to Jesus.
