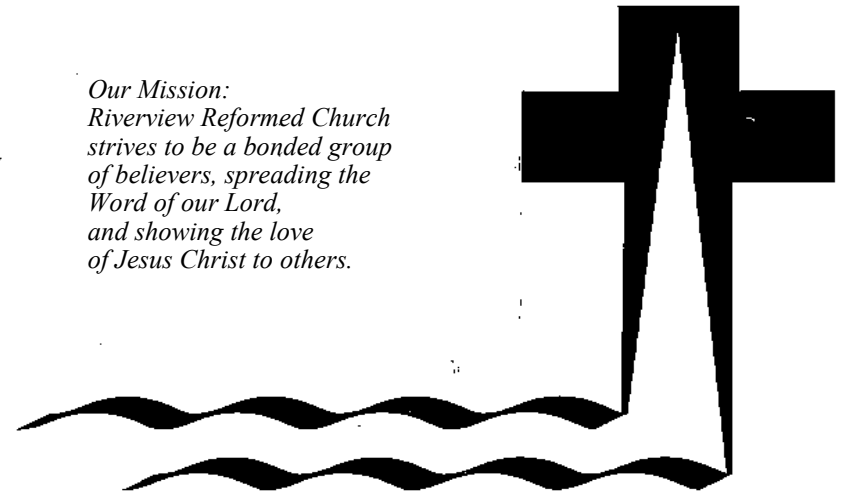

May 9 Consistory Update:

Devotions this month came from John 14:1-6 where we discussed the comfort of Jesus, the exclusion of salvation in Jesus alone, the power of trust and family aspects of Christianity among many things. As Elders, we talked about the need to pray for others and for personal devotions, we discussed those in need in our congregation and how we plan to do communion in June differently. The Deacons continue work on many projects like landscaping and cleaning at our recent spring work day with the help of congregation members, the removal of a broken toilet in the sanctuary, along with projects that are still being worked on like painting trim around the church, adding a new railing to the north door, getting a light fixed and looking into roof issues. Pastor Jake has been looking into other insurance options as better options going forward. Current finances—checking \$18,246.83; loan \$9,232; Hyvee \$12,449.09, Youth \$875.96. The consistory approved an amendment to be made to our Articles of Incorporation through the state. Pastor Jake will be transferring his ordination soon. The consistory continued to wrestle with the future of our church and through a valuable discussion plan to meet with Seth Sundstrom to discern more clearly the why behind the future of RRC and how to maintain that going forward.
