

June 8 Consistory Update:

Last week on June 8, Consistory met with Seth Sundstrom from Dakota Network to discuss why we are a church here in Yankton and our future as a church. For our devotion, we considered Exodus 14:5-14, where we looked at the journey of Israel out of Egypt in the face of an Egyptian Army that was threatening them with death. We reflected on various aspects of the passage like the hardening of Pharaoh's heart, the fear and anxiety that Israel was probably feeling, the slavery of Israel and wanting to go back of it in the face of death, the struggle of faith in the future God had for Israel. We reflected on how this connected with our church's present as we wrestle with the future of our church, how for awhile years, we have heard frustration, fear, anxiety, sadness, discouragement, wondering if our church is dying which has often led us to look back to when we saw life in the church and how we struggle to see life in our church's future. We discussed the lifecycle of a church, what we want from church vs. what is a true Christian church, and the why, what and how's of Riverview Reformed Church. AS we look to the promises of life God has for us going forward, we discussed the need for testimony in our church to how God has been at work and is at work in our lives, the need for discipleship opportunities for all the groups in our church like introverts for example and the need to continue to point to being committed to Jesus.
