

RIVERVIEW REFORMED CHURCH ~CELEBRATING 60 YEARS~

The first services were held in the newly completed building of the *"Yankton Reformed Church"* on February 18, 1962. On September 5, 1962 the church was renamed Riverview Park Reformed Church, derived from the name of that section of Yankton.... the Riverview Park Addition.

On October 5, 2008 the Riverview Park Reformed congregation began the Sunday worship service at the original church home located at 19th and Burleigh Streets and then walked the 2 blocks to conclude the service at the new church home at 17th and Burleigh Streets. With this move the name was shortened to Riverview Reformed Church as we are no longer in the Riverview Park Addition.

September 12 CONSISTORY

Our devotions for this month came from Nehemiah 2:11-20, where we explored the need for willingness to hear and obey God, strong leadership, weather opposition and the ability to face our fears as the people of God rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem and as we consider the future of RRC.. The Elders reflected on the questions we ask ourselves each month about how our members are and who have reached out to, which led to a conversation of about who are our members and the role accountability will play in the Alliance and in the future of our church. We also moved communion from Oct 2 to the 9th. The Deacons stated that the checking balance is \$9055.18 with only \$3376 left to pay off our loan. There was also discussion of a high water bill, getting a knox box for church and fixes done to the roof. As a Consistory, we approved new By-Laws that will be voted on in the Congregational Meeting in November, where we will also be voting for new Elders and Deacons
