

On September 5, 1962 the church was renamed Riverview Park Reformed Church, derived from the name of that section of Yankton...the Riverview Park Addition. On October 5, 2008 the Riverview Park Reformed congregation began the Sunday worship service at the original church home located at 19th and Burleigh Streets and

then walked the 2 blocks to conclude the service at the new church home at 17th and Burleigh Streets. With this move the name was shortened to Riverview Reformed Church as we are no longer in the Riverview Park Addition.
