October 10 Consistory Update: Our devotions were from 1 Corinthians 12:4-14 where we talked about the various spiritual gifts that believers possess and how no believer is greater than the other, but we all need each other and the spiritual gifts they bring, to be the one body united in Jesus, as we seek to be his church. As elders we discussed new people at church, people we haven't seen in awhile, and others who have been visiting. There was also talk about future professions of faith, communion, sermon topics and a rep for the upcoming Network meeting. As Deacons, there was discussion around how many keys have been identified, a successful work day, Mission of the Month being Samaritan's Purse for Christmas Boxes, snow removal and other maintenance matters, such as toilets. Current finances for checking is at \$11,051.31, Hyvee is at \$17,000, with \$5000 to be moved to checking and mortgage loan completion. The rest of Consistory focused around Pastor Jake's responsibilities, Election and Nominations, the upcoming Congregational Meeting and Cub Scouts Group using some of our chairs and tables.
