

January 9 Consistory Update: This month we began Consistory looking at Acts 1:12-26 where we had a good conversation about the importance of prayer, discerning God's will, the connection of believers, and the process of filling positions of leadership chosen by God. The elders discussed how we have an upcoming baptism, transfer of membership, care for members and communion schedule. As deacons, there was discussion around things they are working on, such as the soupless soup kitchen, bathrooms, Knox box, and other building and grounds issues. The main discussion was around the budget that was just approved, employee appreciation and our current finances. As of the meeting our bank balance, figuring outstanding payments for this week, stood at \$5933.32, with the understanding there were outstanding payments waiting to be paid until more funds came in to pay them. While the HyVee account for building funds stands close to \$12,000, it was acknowledged that our current bank balance and the ability to pay bills is very reliant on our weekly offering. The rest of the consistory there was discussion around the Ministry teams, what is going on in the Yankton Ministerial helping those without homes, and a request for help from the Living Stone Prison Church in Springfield.
