

September 11 Consistory: Devotions were from Joshua 24:16-28, this led to a great discussion about it is easier said than done to commit our lives fully to God, we need to know the character of God, the importance of a covenant and we are called to be witnesses to what God has done and to our commitment to follow him. The Elders discussed the needs of various congregation members. those pursuing profession of faith, ways to communicate members and visitors, membership review letter follow up and October 1 communion. The Deacons discussed that there is still outstanding bills to be paid from snow removal last inter, repairs being done in the church, the nursery toilet is still not working and worry what it will cost to fix or to find other solutions, putting address of church up at various places on the building, and an idea for a TV in the nursery for people to see visuals in sermons. Current finances: checking \$10,991.92, Hyvee \$14, 245.12 and youth \$973;46. After hearing these reports the Consistory discussed changes and opportunities that could be discussed at Ministry Teams especially considering getting people involved in things they find to be a priority in the life of our church and following Jesus. The Consistory continued their discussion on the future of the church around reasons for hope and areas that are unhealthy, as we continue in this conversation we encouraged each other and the congregation to continue to pray while also considering what is God's pathway for RRC and what vision do we have for the church in the next 5 years. We heard updates from the Alliance, our denomination, how our network is now Midwest Network instead of Dakota Network. If you want to hear about more updates from the Alliance, ask a Consistory member or if you want to watch videos of the Global Gathering from last month. Lastly, we voted to change the Consistory from 5 Elders and Deacons to 5 Elders and 4 Deacons starting this January.
