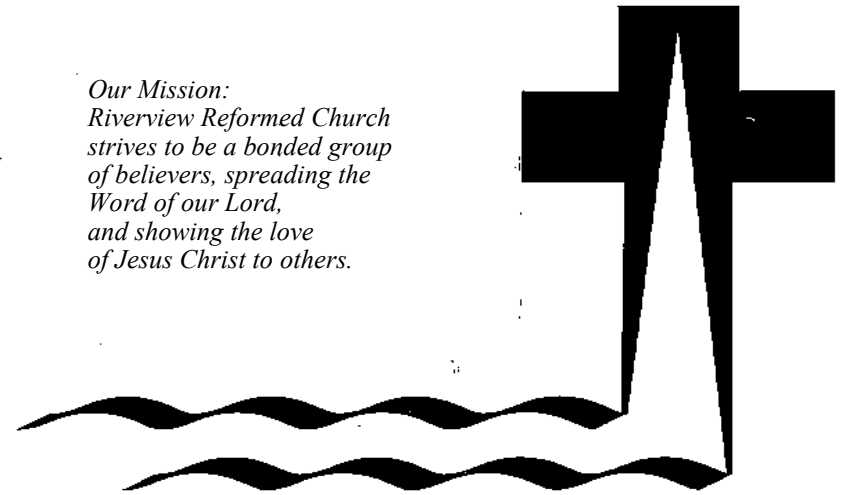

March 11 Consistory Report: Our devotion this month was from Acts 1:1-11 where we discussed God's abundance, a call to appreciate what God has done, the confusion and uncertainty the disciples were feeling, the angels response, how God answers prayers in his timing and his way, and lastly its call to be witness to Jesus and to share it with all the world. It was decided to make Acts 1:7-8 our new verse to pray over, with a new time of 1:09 pm, along with other prayer opportunities. Consistory also covered an update of the work of the Next Steps team. The Alliance of Reformed Churches and Emergency Management and use of our facilities. As Elders we discussed those with health issues in need of prayer, filling Pulpit supply and Communion for April 7 and Maundy Thursday.
