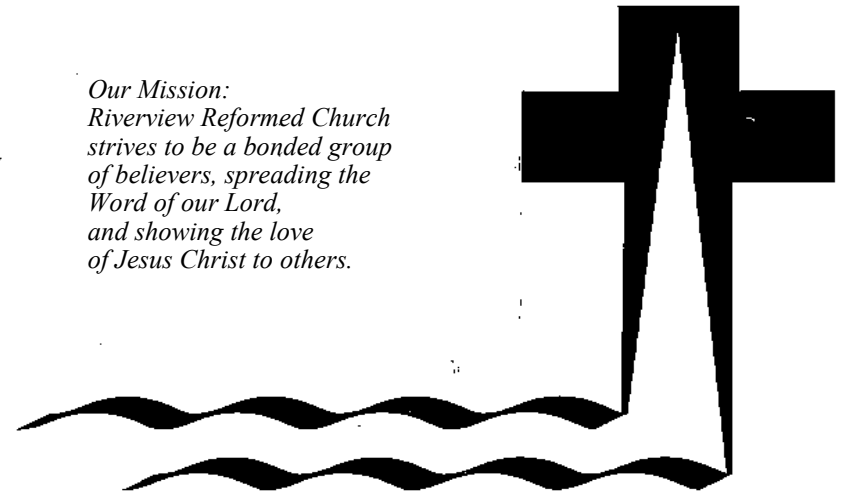

The more people we have involved, the easier it is for everyone. Please prayerfully consider where you may be able to help out.

JULY 8 CONSISTORY REPORT: At the Consistory meeting this month, we began with reflection on a chapter from the "*Anatomy of a Revived Church: Introduction Chapter.*" We had much discussion around how many churches struggle with people being too busy or comfortable to see God's will for his church. There was much discussion around the need for change because the world around us has changed and is changing constantly but the question for us is how do we meet those changes with the unchangeable truth like the Gospel of Jesus. We also discussed a powerful illustration used in the book between the choice many churches are facing to change or die, like someone who had a heart bypass where the Doctor says they could improve their situation by diet and exercise but choose not to, which may not feel like it is a choice to die. Elders discussed praises and prayer concerns in the church regarding members. Deacons reported current finances to be \$42,720, HyVee \$16,824, and Youth \$1,193. We also discussed ongoing projects or things they are keeping their eye on, a recent support for Adam Hoyt's mission work, things they are looking to get rid of, and proposals they are considering. Report on the Alliance of Reformed Churches was given with Tim Vink no longer in a leadership position and calls to pray and support many of our sister churches affected by flooding in NW Iowa, SD and MN. The Consistory considered a proposal from the Next Steps team. No decision was made but further discussion is planned at the next meeting.

FECC Future Many of you have been asking about the future of FECC. The board has officially dissolved and the Consistory currently wants to see if we can do what we can to keep things going. Currently we need to create a temporary board to keep things going and to find others to join this. If you are interested in seeing FECC continue, contact Pastor Jake.
