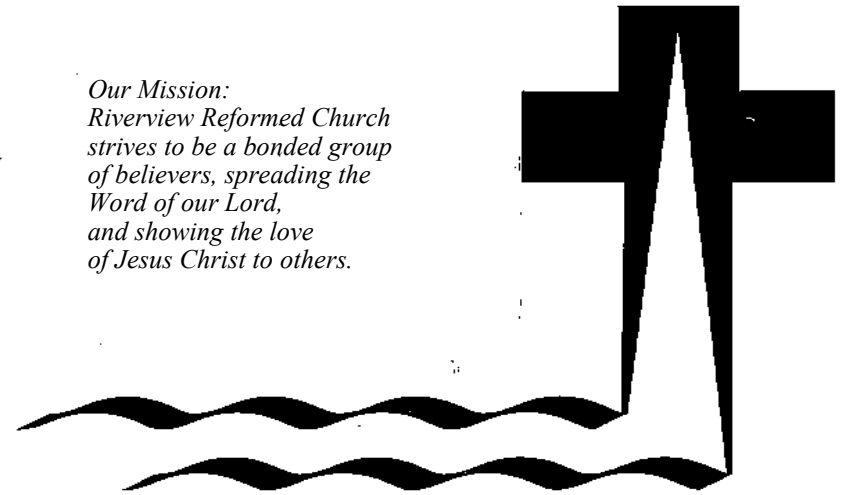

August 12 Consistory Report: Consistory met with the intention to continue to build a framework for Ministry teams based on new Vision and Mission statements. We began with devotions from Ch. 1 of "Anatomy of a Revived Church". We discussed our responsibility as members of this church to do God's will and for how we have failed to be obedient. There was much discussion about not being entirely sure of the path forward, but it is important to take our first steps toward living into God's will for us to Know Jesus and Make Jesus Known. There were some ideas thrown out there but there was a great desire to identify what needs to be done and do it. There was hope based on other churches being able to see new life with just simple steps or even despite what we might think are difficult circumstances. We then went on to use the Eisenhower matrix to talk about each Ministry team and how we can identify what are the most important or urgent things we need to attend based on our vision. There is still much work to be done but pray for the leadership of our church to be empowered to make important decisions and to be able to live into them. Elder and Deacons will meet separately some other time this month.
