

September 9 Consistory Report

At our latest Consistory meeting on September 9, for our devotions we continued going through the book "Anatomy of a Revitalized Church". The chapter focused on traditions and while they can be good, when they become more important than following Jesus, they can really bring death to a church. We talked about the traditions of a church like parts of the building, time of worship, pastoral duties, pews, fellowship time, among many other things. As a consistory, we also discussed a proposed framework based on the vision and mission statements we have been working on: Know Jesus + Make Jesus Known, Share Jesus in an Uncertain World Led by the Spirit. However, when considering if we are willing and able to live into or lead these, the consensus was currently no because of fear, uncertainty and a feeling of being ill equipped to live into this reality of sharing Jesus with others. In the Elders meeting, we talked about needs of people in the church, updates on Profession of Faith classes, and October Communion. As Deacons, they discussed budget; checking \$44,810, HyVee \$17,749, and Youth \$1,173. They are also working on new bids for snow removal, welcome signs, mission of the month to Women's Shelter and Sack Pack, moving pews and chairs and tables, inventory assets, paying to keep FECC non-profit going, and Robert Palsma resigning as Janitor.

PRAYER OPPORTUNITY: There has been a document created to help focus our prayers for the future of RRC. If you would like a copy of the document that helps focus our prayers as RRC considers the future, please ask Pastor Jake for a copy. Here are some options for ways to pray:

*Pray individually at home, at church, or walking around the church. This can be done with the prayer document mentioned above or however you feel led, but be encouraged to pray for our church.

*A while back we invited people to pray at 3:05 based on a passage from John 15:5. The Consistory has decided to update the time we are praying and the verse we are praying over. This comes from the work that Consistory has been doing, we invite you to pray at 1:08 every day based on Acts 1:7-8 NIV, which says, "He said to them: 'It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'"
