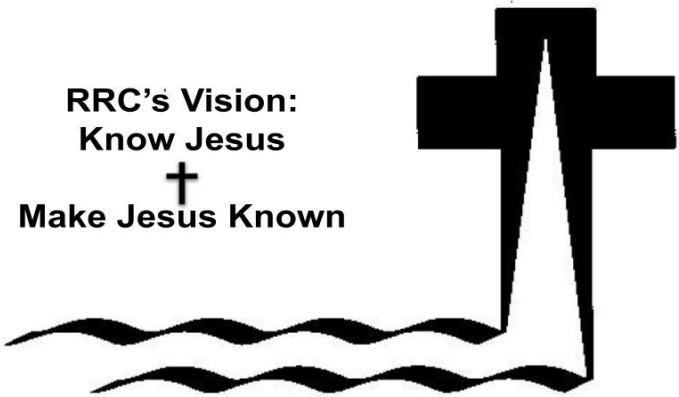

July 14 Consistory Report Our meeting began with a reflection from Matthew 3:7-12 and a call of repentance to God's will, and the assurance of Ephesians 4:7-16 and work God is doing in us and through us. We then looked at an example from Acts 18:18-28 of Christian leadership in the early church in a time of great change, in time of great movement of the Gospel and his servants to people places that didn't know Jesus, and boldness of those willing to make Jesus known in the world. The Elders prayed for members going through struggle and celebration, while also focusing on worship and sharing the word of and sacraments with others. The Deacons reported on finances: Checking \$41,186, HyVee \$13,718, and Youth \$1,158. Mission of the Month offerings have gone to Love Our City and Pathways with future plans for RRC in Riverboat Days and Cultivate Co-op which does Rocky Mountain High. The Deacons also discussed ads in the paper, RRC's sign reposting, Counseling Center new sign with name change to Anew Haven of Hope, projects around the church like AC in nursery, issues with sink in Janitors closet and possible water in church after rainstorms. The rest of consistory was focused on how we want to move forward after that congregation viewing of Sam Hamstra's video back in May. We discussed that the congregation seems to have strong views of how they want to know Jesus which lies in his first category of keep doing what we are doing, the questions before us then is how we will live into our vision that also calls us to Make Jesus Known. Time is needed to discern how God is leading the Consistory to move forward to lead the church in the future He has for it. Discussion was had around Pastor Jake's job responsibilities, a possible Youth Ministry conference and Pastor Jake taking vacation on August 24 and August 31.

Community Opportunity:

At Girls on the Run, we believe that every girl belongs at the finish line. Through a compelling blend of movement-based games and thought-provoking discussion, our programs ignite confidence in girls when they need it most. So much more than running, this evidence-based curriculum unlocks the power and potential in every girl. At the heart of our program is our dedicated volunteer coaches! As a coach, you would guide small groups of girls through our curricula that helps girls: Develop essential skills to lead an emotionally and physically healthy life, participate in dynamic discussions, inclusive activities and fun games, learn the value of setting goals by preparing for a celebratory 5K, make a difference locally by planning and implementing a community impact project. Throughout the season, girls meet their trained coaches twice a week after school over the course of 8 weeks. Coaches are provided with all the resources, training and tools they need to operate a memorable and successful program. You do NOT need to be a runner to be a GOTR coach. We ask all coaches to commit to volunteering one day a week for 1.5 hours during the 8 week season as well as complete our New Coach Training and a background check. Fall season starts in September.
