

<u>August 11 Consistory report</u>

Consistory began with a time of reflection on how we have seen God at work personally or at church. And what ways was God calling you or church to grow in? Devotions were from 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 where we were reminded of the power of the resurrection of iesus, the gifts God has give us, how God uses sinners all the time to share the Gospel of Jesus and God is with us. Elders reported discussion around highlights of the last year in the church and areas of struggle in the last year. There was discussion around members going through difficult times and situations for celebration, like new members and upcoming baptism. Also, continue to hear positive feed back on how we are doing communion. Deacons reported on the sign getting fixed soon, new AC in nursery, ads going out in papers for church, sink in janitor's closet fixed and some other projects they are still considering. Current Finances: checking \$40,086; HyVee \$16,181; Youth \$1,158. As the Consistory meeting continued we discussed the next Ministry Teams meeting September 10 at 6 PM, Sack Pack on October 14 and whether to do a potluck to start Sunday School year. There was conversation around Pastor Jake's primary responsibilities. Last month we challenged each other to pray for the future of the church and how to Make Jesus Known with some ideas discussed. Alliance update was given with the next Network meeting being November 14-15, and the Revitalization team will be doing a book study in September using a book that Consistory just got done studying, "Anatomy of a Revived Church". Pastor Jake got approved to go to a Youth Group Conference on Sept. 11. Lastly, there was celebration with how Love our City when over 10 people from our church helped serve people in our community in partnership with other churches in Yankton.

### **Community Opportunity:**

**At Girls on the Run**, we believe that every girl belongs at the finish line. Through a compelling blend of movement-based games and thought-provoking discussion, our programs ignite confidence in girls when they need it most. So much more than running. this evidence-based curriculum unlocks the power and potential in every girl. At the heart of our program is our dedicated volunteer coaches!
