

CONSISTORY NOTES: Consistory met on 2/9/26. We opened with prayer. A zoom meeting was held with Jeff Allen from Thrive Coaching Network. Good participation by the congregation was noted and discussion centered on Round Table #1. Seth Sundstrom used a car to explain how the round tables work. The first one looked in the "rear view mirror" (our past). The next Round table will focus on "looking under the hood" (our present), and the last one will focus on "looking through the windshield" (our future). Everyone is asked to put March 8 and March 22 on their calendars so they attend the next 2 Round Tables. It doesn't matter if you missed the first one, we urge you to attend the next meetings. Devotions were from 1 Corinthians 1:10. New members will be recognized at an upcoming service. Approval to expand Cinderella's Closet was voted for.
